Full payment or part-payment (\$100.00) is required by **Friday, 6 December 2019** per student (not per family). If you select part-payment, the remaining balance is required by **Friday, 24 January, 2020**.

Payment can only be made via QKR.  
Cash or EFTPOS payments will **NOT** be accepted.

If you are experiencing hardship, please contact the office to arrange a payment plan by **Tuesday, 3 December 2019**. All Parent Payment Plans require a \$50 per student minimum deposit. Parent Payment Plans will not be accepted after this date.

Students will **ONLY** receive their stationary items once full payment has been received or a payment plan arranged. If no payment has been received by the due dates, only minimal stationary supplies will be provided to commence the year until full payment or a payment plan has been approved with the school office.

# Statement of Charges for 2020



All parents/guardians are required to pay Essential Education Items as requested. The final charge has been carefully calculated to take into consideration the total services and support required at each year level to ensure students receive the high-level education opportunities they deserve.
